ECO-iLEADER

Open to students in 7-13 who are passionate about environmental issues and are willing to act within school and across the wider community. The role involves producing new initiatives for the school to gain the annual Eco Schools Green Flag award. Eco iLeaders will have the opportunity to work in a team to design projects, raise awareness and educate others about environmental problems within the school. Meetings are held every week after-school on Thursdays. Lead Staff: Mrs Wood

DIVERSITY ILEADER

An opportunity for students to lead on our Respect, Equality & Diversity drive at Ilkley Grammar school to ensure we create a fully inclusive environment that embraces and celebrates our diversities and differences equally whether that be race, religion, physicality, gender, or personalities. There will be opportunities to create and/or present assemblies, liaise with the student council, student leadership team, take a role in our Diversity Day, promote and celebrate key times of the year via displays and events. This will also include liaising with the wider community to help promote and champion an inclusive culture at IGS. You will also play a part in helping IGS become a RED award champion, a national award that recognises our changing culture of Respect, Equality & Diversity. Lead Staff: Mr Kehoe

LGBTQ+ SAFE SPACE ILEADER

An opportunity to continue to champion LGBTQ+ rights at IGS, help run the Safe Space area for students who identify as LGBTQ+ to help them feel safe and feel supported. There will be opportunities across the year to run projects and take part in workshops, organise, create and/or deliver assemblies where you feel comfortable enough to do so during LGBTQ+ history month and Pride month. You can also help play a role in our LGBTQ+ workshop on Diversity Day as well as plan events with the wider community leading up to Ilkley Pride. Lead staff: Mr Kehoe

SUBJECT ILEADER

Represent a subject at Open Evenings, promote the subject you love to other students in the wider community, support subject staff and run interventions or create display boards for corridors and classroom. Check the Subject iLeader Department List to see if your chosen subject is offering this role.

MODEL UNITED NATIONS HEAD ILEADERS

Open to all students with an interest in global issues and politics but also for those who are organised, diligent and can work well as a team. This role would require you to work alongside our existing MUN Head iLeaders, to set up and run prep sessions once a fortnight, as well as conventions each half-term.

MODEL UNITED NATIONS

This is open to all students, and especially to those with an interest in global issues and politics. Students will meet once a fortnight to discuss current global issues over their choosing, and work towards a school convention each half-term. At conventions students will act as delegates and represent a country from around the world. After conventions follow-up activities such as contacting local media outlets and MPs will take place. Students will work alongside those from other years and will develop their organisational, communication and public speaking skills through this project. Lead staff: Mr Mills and Mrs Shah

KS3 DRAMA SUBJECT SUPPORT ILEADER

We are looking for students who would like to work in Year 7 or 8 Drama lessons to support the teaching of Drama. You will work alongside the teacher to support students' practical and writing skills in Drama.

You will need to commit to two lessons per cycle which will be organised around your timetable.

In your application you need to write about what skills you feel you can bring to this role and why you are applying for it. Accreditation through the SSAT can be awarded. Lead Staff: Ms Ramrattan

POST-16 ENGLISH ACADEMIC MENTOR

Considering teaching, coaching or working with young people as a future career? Looking for an opportunity to prove commitment to society for a UCAS application? This role will involve you being an 'English Academic Mentor' to one of our new Y11 cohort. You will meet with them on a regular basis to:

- Improve self-efficacy and resilience.

- -Model from a peer perspective how to best unlock their potential.
- Equip students with resources and strategies to further unlock independent study.
- Assist with planning / organisation of their English revision.
- Monitor engagement and progress, evaluate impact and plan strategies

You will be given training so that you understand the best ways to support them.

POST-16 ENGLISH LEARNING SUPPORT ASSISSTANT

Considering teaching or working with young people as a future career? Looking for an opportunity to develop these skills and demonstrate a passion for nurturing young minds? This role will involve you being a learning support assistant within English lessons, encouraging younger pupils to achieve their potential. You will be required to dedicate at least one period a cycle to this role. You can choose whether you want KS3 or KS4. DRAMA/THEATRE STUDIES AMBASSADOR

We are looking for students who can promote the importance of Drama/Theatre Studies at various events for parents and students lower down the school. You will need to be a positive role model who can foster a love of the art form. You will talk to students and parents about the importance of the subject, how it relates to everyday life as well as the world of performance. You will be involved in Open Evenings and talks with students as well as creating promotional displays/materials.

DRAMA/THEATRE STUDIES SUBJECT MENTOR

We are looking for students who can work either one-to-one or with small groups of either Yr11 Drama GCSE students or Yr10 BTEC Performing Arts students. You will come into a minimum of two Drama/Performing Arts lessons across the cycle. In the GCSE Yr11 lessons you will work with the student(s) to support and boost their acting skills for their Text Performances and their ability to write about 'Blood Brothers' and write a Theatre Review for their written exam. In the BTEC Performing Arts lessons you will work with the students to support and boost their acting skills for their Text Performances and their ability to write about the roles, responsibilities and skills of the practitioners.

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SPORTS COUNCIL:

Open to students in Year 7-13 who have a real passion for PE and Sport. This role will involve being a representative for PE and Sport within your year group. Members of the Sports Council will be expected to attend half-termly meetings, assist in the planning and leadership of events such as Sports Presentation Evening and Sports Day and assist the PE department with any tasks or duties. Traditionally, the members of the Sports Council are involved in creating a fundraising project each academic year, with great success raising thousands of pounds for both IGS PE and chosen charities. MUSIC ILEADER: TECHNICIAN

The ideal candidate for this role will be able to re-string and tune guitars/bass guitars and ukuleles. You will be required to check keyboards/electric pianos and amplifiers and report any faults to Music Staff. Headphone maintenance may be required from time to time. We would require one lesson per cycle and perhaps the flexibility to assist at live concerts/events in school. (suitable for KS4 or 5 student) Lead Staff: Mrs Chapman

ANTI-BULLYING ILEADER

A leadership opportunity for students who have experience in antibullying to support student feeling threatened or uncomfortable but reluctant to speak to an adult. You will have to offer advice, support and strategies. Lead staff: Miss Walsh

CREATIVE WRITING CLUB LEAD STUDENT For the role of Creative Writing Club Lead Student, we would require you to be passionate about creative writing and English to help lead and manage the club. You will need proficient skills in spelling, punctuation and grammar as well as listening skills. When at one of our writing meets, you would need to curate prompts for the students to work on, be a positive and inspiring role model for younger students who are looking to develop their creative skill and be willing to constructively challenge members of the club to help hone their craft. You may also be involved in organising creative writing competitions for students along with attending and facilitating the club meeting each Thursday on week B. Lead Staff: Miss Reid

STEM CHALLENGE ILEADER

Come help support and guide our Y7 and Y8 students on Thursday lunch times in their STEM club. Activities include rocket building, fire writing, making bouncing bubbles and helping them with their own projects for the Summer Science Fair. If you're keen, you can even plan some fun science activities yourselves to do with the students! This iLeader role is open to students in Y12 and Y13 and it will run on a rota system (in other words, you won't have to do it every week but a few times a term).

DANCE ILEADER

We are looking for someone to run Dance Club which will be open to all students of all dancing ability. The successful applicant will choreograph dances in a range of styles and run the club. FRONT OF HOUSE ILEADER

An exciting opportunity open to students in Y7-13 to be a member of the Front of House team for music events this year. This role will involve greeting, ushering and looking after the audience at public music events (e.g., Battle of the Bands, Christmas Concert). The Front of House team will meet once per half term and must be available to attend evening music events in the school calendar. This role would suit students that are interested in developing skills and learning how to run music events.
