On Wednesday, students from Year 12 were once again given the opportunity to compete in the Royal Society of Chemistry's Schools' Analyst Competition.

The Schools' Analyst Competition enables students competing in Year 12 in England, Wales, and Northern Ireland, S5 in Scotland or 5th Year in Republic of Ireland to demonstrate and expand on their existing chemistry knowledge, skills and aptitude for analytical science through practical analytical experiments based on relevant societal or industrial problems.

The students carried out titrations to quantify the vitamin C content of different brands of vitamin supplement; they used a technique called thin layer chromatography (TLC) to check for the presence of banned food colourings in sweets; and finally, they used a neutralisation reaction to determine the relative quantity of sodium bicarbonate in packaged cake mixtures.

The students were required to work independently, methodically and with a high level of precision and accuracy. The final measurements, calculations and conclusions have been submitted by each team and we eagerly await the results of the competition.


