### FORTNIGHTLY HIGHLIGHTS

It has been a very busy first two weeks of the final half-term with a range of events and activities that continue to engage our students. These have included the bronze Duke of Edinburgh practice expedition where students demonstrated teamwork and resilience whilst gaining valuable experience in preparation for their qualifying weekend on June 29th/30th. GCSE geography students have completed fieldwork, history students have visited the Cold War Bunker in York, and 100 business and maths students toured the Etihad Stadium, learning about its operation as a business and gaining insights into the behind-the-scenes world of professional sport.

The opportunities for high-level competitive sport continue with our under 18s tennis team securing their place in the national Glanville Cup for the second consecutive year. Our year 7 football team reached the final of the Leeds League Cup and our U14 girls team were runners up in the Leeds Football League and the Leeds Cup. I was privileged to be able to watch both the year 7 and 9 teams in their recent football finals and, although on the day we weren't able to secure the victories they deserved, both teams played with pride and determination and were a credit to the school and their families.

This week, year 10 students have benefitted from mock interviews, honing their skills and building confidence for future job opportunities. Creative arts festival rehearsals are also well underway, with students showcasing their talents and preparing for what promises to be great events on the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4th July. There will be a full write up of these events in subsequent editions of the bulletin.

Additionally, our exam calendar has been in full stride with GCSE, BTEC and A-level exams taking place, alongside Year 12 mock exams. Our students are tackling these important public examinations and assessments with determination and focus, and we are immensely proud of their hard work and commitment. We wish all the students with remaining exams next week the very best of luck!

Preparations for the student election, which will run alongside the national election, are progressing well. Next week also sees our Next Steps week for year 12 students, our trained ball crew will be on the courts at the world-class Lexus llkley Trophy Tournament and many of our year 11s will be celebrating in style at their prom.

We will also be launching a consultation on a change to the mobile phone policy for September 2024. This will be sent to parent/carers for your feedback next week and we would appreciate you taking the time to give us your views before we make a final decision.

Daniel Tomblin, I I MTH, will be taking part in a sponsored swim in the school pool on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June.



Careers assembly by Jonathan Smith, IGS alumni and Director of International Football Schools for Manchester City Football Club.



Following a visit to the Etihad Stadium by over 100 year 10 students last week for a maths/business trip, on Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> June, we were delighted to welcome IGS alumni Jonathan Smith back to B:Hall where he had previously sat himself as a teenager. In a fascinating assembly Jonathan described his own career journey and how, following his degree, he had worked in a number of different sectors before arriving at Manchester City, showing students a photo of him and 'Pep' at the Etihad stadium from last week.

Jonathan explained that the City Football Group is a global company which includes 13 different clubs, and which provides entertainment for over a billion people globally with a TV audience of 786 million people for Man City alone. He explained how an organisation like CFG does not just employ footballers (around 100) but actually employs over 700 people in total across multiple sectors such as design, analytics, retail, marketing, corporate and sponsorship.

Students were told that the key skills and personal qualities Manchester City are looking for in employees (which are just as important as exam results) are **teamwork**, **communication**, **resilience**, **creativity**, **drive**, **curiosity** and **kindness** and that at CFG there is a culture of *continual improvement* where *everybody counts*.

His final piece of advice was as simple as it was powerful: When thinking about a career try to find an organisation that interests you where you can combine what you are good at with what you enjoy.

### Year 9 RE Linking Conference at Bradford City Hall

On Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> June Ms Claughton and Mr Gutch took 12 year 9 students (all who have chosen to study Philosophy & Ethics for GCSE next year) to the RE Linking Conference at Bradford City Hall organised by the Linking Network.

Our students were paired up at conference tables with students from Bronte Girls Academy in Bradford and the activities started with some games to get the students warmed up and interacting with each other. It didn't take long!

The central theme of the 1/2 day conference, hosted by Azam Ali from New College Bradford, was how different religions address the question of 'suffering'. The session began with a challenging photograph showing a child in South Sudan suffering from hunger and thirst and students were asked to discuss how God could allow this to happen and whether this might lead people to question the existence of God. After some excellent contributions from students the session moved on to presentations from two local religious representatives, the first of whom (a Muslim) had been the first full-time multi-faith court chaplain in the UK. Latif Mir spoke powerfully of how his job was to be with people during the darkest days of their lives and how the Muslim faith strongly encourages people to support others in their hour of need. He also spoke of how helping others is to 'build paradise', that suffering is not a punishment, everything is temporary, and that only God, in his infinite wisdom truly understands why suffering exists.

Students then listened to Beth, a practising Christian who works with churches and youth groups in Bradford. She spoke about how school can be a hard place for young people and that over the course of a life everyone experiences suffering. She quoted one of her favourite passages from the bible - 'The Lord God is compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love.' She explained that for Christians suffering is an inevitable part of life even though we wish it could be different. She said that for her it is important to hold two ideas at the same time - that there is suffering in the world and that God is loving. She said that we must refuse to look at it in black and white terms – it is both/and, not either/or. She also explained how many Christians believe that God can 'repurpose our suffering' – take it and turn it into something good and she challenged those present to be *curious* about suffering and to not accept easy answers.

After these personal and fascinating presentations, during which it emerged that both faiths share many similar insights into the 'problem of pain', the students took part in an RE themed treasure hunt before being given a tour of Bradford City Hall. As part of the introduction, they were told many facts about the building and about the city, and in particular, about how Bradford has been recognised one of the top 10 places in the UK for charitable giving and was the only city in Yorkshire to make it onto the list.

As the UK City of Culture for 2025 Bradford is surely one of the most exciting places in the country to be right now and it was a pleasure to take a group of students to the centre of this great city and to reflect with them on the 'big questions' of life in the beautiful setting of the City Hall banqueting suite. All students participated really well and were a credit to the school.
