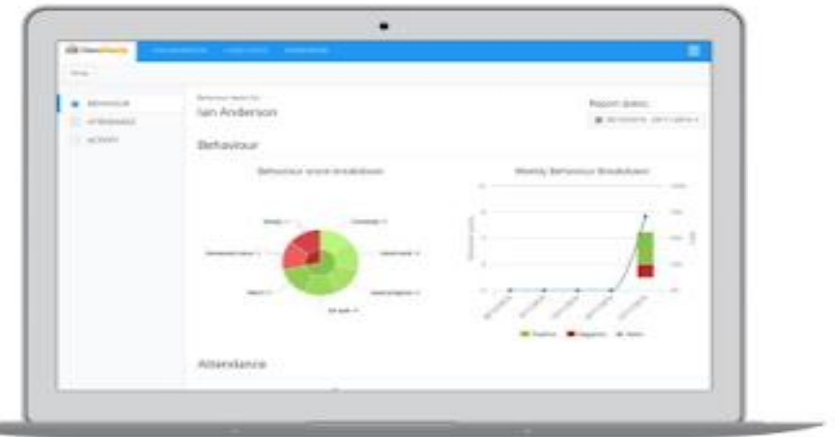

Attendance

- You, as parents and carers, have a legal responsibility to ensure that your child attends school regularly.

- Attendance data is monitored regularly and interventions are put into place.

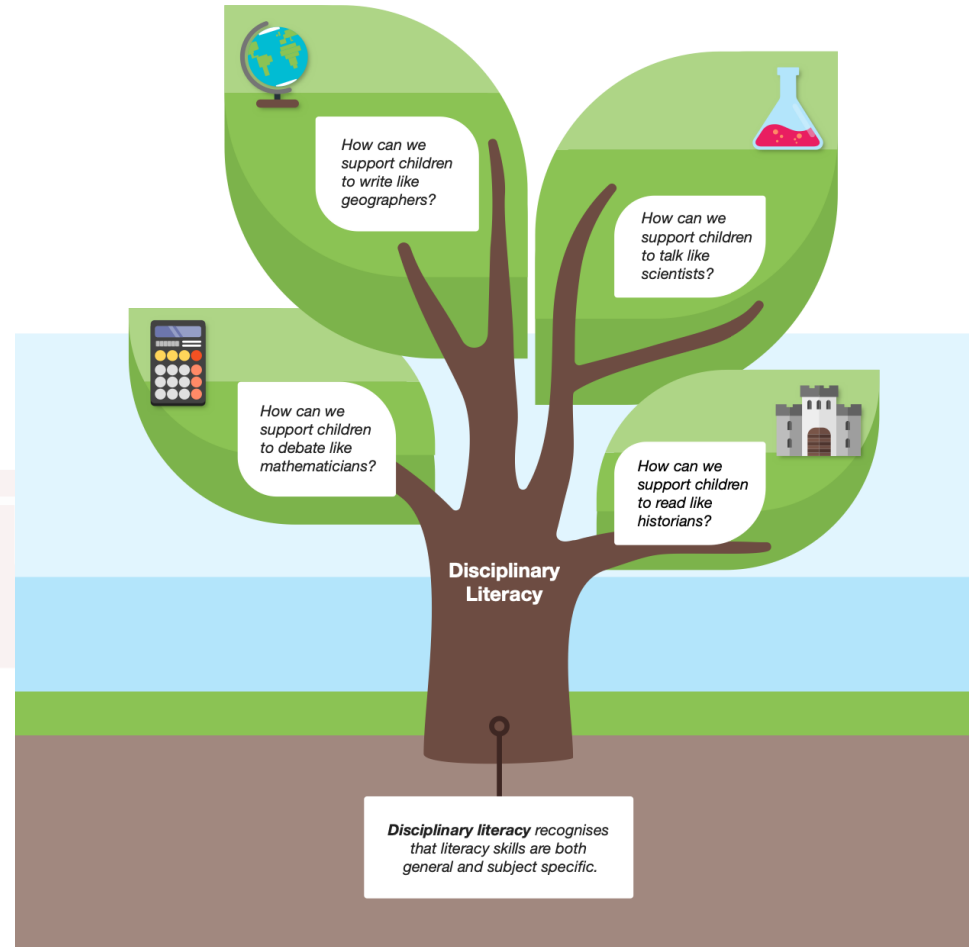
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Year Seven Oracy Programme 2024-25

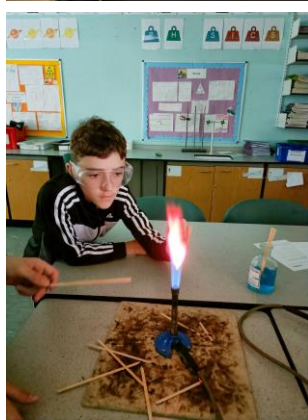

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The Role of the Year 7 Form Tutor

- Much like the year 6 primary class teacher;
- Student wellbeing and pastoral care are our priorities;
- First point of contact and channel of communication (attendance calls);
- Daily uniform and equipment checks;
- Behaviour monitoring;
- Academic progress tracking and review.

What to expect during the first couple of weeks:

Time to get to know the young people as individuals

Help everyone to settle in

Opportunities to meet staff and build up relationships with them, both class teachers and form tutors

Make new friends

Time to get to know the physical environment of the school

Information shared about Parent Pay and Classcharts log-ins with parents, carers and students

A chance to sign up to Extra-Curricular activities/clubs

Challenge themselves at Nell Bank

Our School Uniform

Uniform requirements are outlined in the transition booklet, which can be found on the school website

Parents and Carers asked:

Is there any seasonal variation to the uniform for the boys eg. can they wear shorts instead of trousers - for example like girls can wear skirts as an alternative to trousers in hot weather?

Currently boys are required to wear trousers all year round.

Can shirts be short sleeved normal shirts or polo shirts, again for in hot weather?

Yes, students may wear short-sleeved shirts but not polo shirts.
