Roxy is heading for tennis superstardom. When tragedy strikes, their worlds are ripped apart. Can they come together before it's too late?</p>
	<p><b>Do Androids Dream of Electric Sheep? By Philip K Dick.</b></p> <p>First published 1968.</p> <p>War has left earth devastated. Through the ruins stalks Rick Deckard, in search of renegade androids he has a license to 'retire'. His big dream - to own a real 'live' animal. Then he gets a big assignment - to kill six Nexus-6 androids, for a huge reward. But things are never easy, and the androids don't want to be found!</p> <p>This is the novel that inspired the film <i>Blade Runner</i>.</p>
	<p><b>Birdsong by Sebastian Faulkes.</b></p> <p>This intensely romantic yet stunningly realistic novel spans three generations and the unimaginable gulf between the First World War and the present.</p>
	<p><b>Looking For Alaska by John Green.</b></p> <p>Alaska Young - gorgeous, clever, funny, messed up. Miles Halter could not be more in love. But when disaster strikes, he discovers the value and the pain of living and loving unconditionally.</p>
	<p><b>Unraveller by Frances Hardinge.</b></p> <p>Nettle was only a child when she was cursed to spend her life as a bird, separated from everyone she loved. She was spared this fate by Kellen. Raddith's only Unraveller, gifted with the ability to unweave curses from a victim's soul.</p> <p>When Kellen's power becomes unstable he's in danger of unravelling everything around him, including Nettle. As the pair venture into the shifting Wilds, searching for answers, nothing is as it seems, and with every passing day Kellen feels his control weakening ....</p>

	<p><b>Never Let Me Go by Kazuo Ishiguro.</b></p> <p>In this novel, the author imagines the lives of a group of students growing up in a darkly skewed version of contemporary England. Narrated by Kathy, now thirty one, <i>Never Let Me Go</i> dramatises her attempts to come to terms with her childhood at the seemingly idyllic Hailsham School and with the fate that has always awaited her and her closest friends in the wider world. A story of love, friendship and memory, this novel is charged throughout with a sense of the fragility of life.</p>
	<p><b>One by Sarah Crossan</b></p> <p>Grace and Tippi are twins - conjoined twins. And their lives are about to change. No longer able to be homeschooled, they must venture into the world - a world of stares, sneers and cruelty. Will they find more than that at school? Can they find real friends? And what about love? But a heart wrenching decision lies ahead for Tippi and Grace. A decision that could tear them apart. One that will change their lives even more than they ever imagined...</p>
	<p><b>Every Day by David Levithan.</b></p> <p>Each morning A wakes up in a different body. A never knows who it's going to be, but A is used to that. It's all fine. Until A wakes up in the body of Justin and meets Justin's girlfriend Rhiannon. From that moment, all previous rules are abandoned. Finally A has found someone he wants to be with .....every day ...</p>
	<p><b>Atonement Ian McEwan.</b></p> <p>On the hottest day of the summer of 1934, thirteen year old Briony Tallis misinterprets what she sees take place in the garden of her country house. Lives are changed forever and she must spend the rest of her life trying to atone.</p>
	<p><b>A Monster Calls by Patrick Ness.</b></p> <p>The Monster showed up after midnight. As they do. But it isn't the monster Conor's been expecting - not the one from the nightmares he's had nearly every night since his mother started her treatments, not the one with the darkness and the wind and the screaming . . . This monster is something different. Something ancient. Something wild. And it wants the most dangerous thing of all from Conor - it wants the truth.</p>

	<p><b>We Are All Made of Molecules by Susin Nielsen.</b></p> <p>Stewart is geeky, gifted but socially clueless. His mum has died and he misses her every day. Ashley is popular, cool, but doesn't do well at school. Her dad has come out and moved out - but not very far. Their worlds are about to collide - Stewart's dad is moving in with Ashley's mum. Stewart's 89.9% ok with this. Ashley is 110% so not! And things are about to get a lot more mixed up and complicated .....</p>
	<p><b>I Capture the Castle by Dodie Smith.</b></p> <p>'I write this sitting at the kitchen sink' is the first line of a novel about love, sibling rivalry and a bohemian existence in a crumbling castle in the middle of nowhere. Cassandra Mortmain's journal records her fadingly glamorous stepmother, her beautiful, wistful older sister and the man to whom they owe both their isolation and poverty - Father. The author of one experimental novel, and a minor cause celebre, he has since suffered from writer's block and is determined to drag his family down with him. But if the iron has entered Father's soul it hasn't penetrated Cassandra's.</p>
	<p><b>The Lord of the Rings by J R R Tolkien.</b></p> <p><i>The Lord of the Rings</i> tells of the great quest undertaken by Frodo and the Fellowship of the Ring: Gandalf the Wizard; the hobbits Merry, Pippin, and Sam; Gimli the Dwarf; Legolas the Elf; Boromir of Gondor; and a tall, mysterious stranger called Strider.</p>
	<p><b>Oranges Are Not the Only Fruit by Jeanette Winterson.</b></p> <p>This is the story of Jeanette, adopted and brought up by her mother as one of God's elect. Zealous and passionate, she seems destined for life as a missionary, but then she falls for one of her converts.</p> <p>At sixteen, Jeanette decides to leave the church, her home and her family, for the young woman she loves.</p>
	<p><b>The Book Thief by Marcus Zusak.</b></p> <p>It is 1939, in Nazi Germany, and people are dying. Liesel lives with her foster family on Himmel street. Her parents are in a concentration camp. Liesel steals books. This is her story and the story of those who live in her street, when the bombs begin to fall.</p>
