











AVOIDING NARROWING TOO MUCH TOO EARLY



WHY ARE ALL THESE SUBJECTS CORE?



- 1) English, maths, science and RE are statutory in all schools until the end of Key Stage 4
- 2) PSHE helps to develop active, informed and responsible citizens, who stay healthy and are prepared for life in modern Britain, gain relationships and sex education and understand protected characteristics.
- 3) PE provides opportunities to become physically confident which supports health/ fitness.
- 4) IT develops skills for life in a modern, digital world.
- 5) Geography and history are both EBACC subjects and support the development of literacy.
- 6) MFL: In a global society, the ability to speak another language is a recognised and valuable skill. A language is also an essential component of the EBACC.













The English Baccalaureate - GCSE

English	Maths	2 x Science	Language	History Or Geography
Grades 5 - 9				

This is not a new qualification in itself, but recognises students achieving 6 GCSE grades 5-9 in the above academic subjects.

The English Baccalaureate is a combination of 6 traditional academic subjects.

Currently, only History and Geography are recognised as Humanities subjects.

Modern Foreign Languages (French and Spanish) are both available at KS4, although you only need to select one as part of the English Baccalaureate. There is a new structure to the specifications in these subjects for first teaching in 2024 and first exams in 2026.














WHY HAVE OPTIONS BEEN INTRODUCED INTO YEAR 9?

Research shows that that a curriculum designed by student choice encourages motivation, achievement, direction and success.



TAKING A SECOND LANGUAGE

- Students will complete an intensive one year ab initio course (from scratch) in order to prepare them for starting the GCSE alongside their peers who have studied the language in year 7 and 8
- Students will be in a class with other students who have also opted to choose a second language. If students opt to pick up a second language, they can't drop the language they have been learning from year 7 until the end of year 9.

Please note, choosing to study a second language will take up <u>two</u> free option choices.

•We recommend that only students who are **performing well in their first language** will cope with the demands of learning a new language from scratch in year 9. If students are unsure of whether studying two languages would be appropriate, please ask the MFL teacher for their advice.













ARE YEAR 8 STUDENTS MATURE ENOUGH TO BE MAKING CHOICES?

- Many successful schools, locally and nationally run a partial or full options process with considerable success.
- Students will be given further information, advice and guidance to support their decisions.
- The choices are designed to inform the Key Stage 4 process more effectively; students are not locked into GCSE syllabiunlike with a full 3-year KS4.
- If students choose the following combination (with any specialist tech), they can still take all the subjects in year 9 which were compulsory prior to an options process:

X AND Y BANDS

Next year, students will stay in their tutor groups but will be placed into one of **two mixed-ability bands: X or Y band**

- Students will be taught the following subjects in their X or Y band:
- English Maths Science MFL PE
- 5 further subjects (geography, history, computing, RE and PSHE)
- Students will take 6 option choices
- It is likely that **3 of these choices will be taught across the year group** with students from X **and** Y bands. This is also how options in years 10 and 11 will be timetabled.
- The remaining options will be taught in a student's X or Y band
