

#### PARENT/CARER BULLETIN

Dear Parents and Carers,

Following our recent inspection, I am delighted to have been able to share with you the final Ofsted report earlier today, which confirms that Ilkley Grammar School has again been graded as **Outstanding in all areas**: Quality of Education, Behaviour and Attitudes, Personal Development, Sixth-Form Provision, and Leadership and Management.



This is an exceptional achievement and one which is richly deserved by our students, staff and the wider community. Although there is no longer an overall, single word judgement, the Outstanding outcomes in each of the 5 areas of the Ofsted framework reflect the quality of education, care, and support we provide, our high aspirations and standards, and a passion for providing wonderful opportunities and experiences for wider personal development. They are also a testament to our remarkable, talented students of whom I am extremely proud, as well as our committed and supportive staff, parents/carers, governors and trustees who all work together to make Ilkley Grammar School the Outstanding school I am so privileged to lead.

The Inspection Team, led by HMI Richard Jones, were effusive about the school and concluded that "Ilkley Grammar School is an amazing school" where "every pupil gets a chance to shine". Sixth-form provision was also highlighted as "a shining light within school" with inspectors noting that "sixth-form students help set the positive tone for the whole school."

Whilst we encourage you to read the full report, other key findings from the inspection are as follows:



- An extensive personal development offer ensures pupils achieve their personal best. School sports, trips and a vast range of clubs, including Model United Nations, creative writing and musical theatre, enable pupils to flourish.
- Pupils enjoy their lessons and behave in a way that enables deep, meaningful classroom learning.
- Staff are passionate about their subjects, and the impact of this is seen in the classroom.
- Whether pupils excel, or need extra help, this school supports them to fulfil their potential.
- The school offers a rich curriculum that ensures all students achieve well there is ambition for all.
- Pupils achieve excellent, sustained outcomes over time. This is partly due to the holistic approach to the curriculum and bespoke, individualised, pastoral care.
- The school is fully inclusive. Staff believe every pupil can succeed, no matter their background or any challenge they may face
- The school is a calm environment where pupils behave exceptionally well.
- Staff are proactive in supporting families to remove barriers, offering support such as transport to school, wraparound care and mental health support.
- Pupils are knowledgeable about different beliefs and cultures as a result of the curriculum and well-designed activities
- The school also offers well-considered career support, including a 'Future Fest' career fair. Extensive links with industry and higher education help the pupils to make informed decisions
- School leaders have a clear and ambitious vision, which is instrumental in helping all pupils succeed.

With such glowing endorsements across quality of education, behaviour and attitudes, personal development, leadership and management, and sixth-form provision, IGS has further enhanced its reputation as one of the leading comprehensive schools in the north of England. Data released to the school this week further reinforces this with GCSE progress in the top 14% of all schools nationally, including selective grammar schools, and attainment in the top 12% of schools in the country. IGS is also one of a minority of schools to have successfully retained Outstanding judgements in all areas under the new, more rigorous Ofsted framework.

As we proudly celebrate this achievement, I want to express my sincere thanks to everyone who plays a part in making IGS such an exceptional school. This includes you as parents and carers whose continued support, shared commitment to education, and positive collaboration with the school really does make a positive difference.

Although the report identified no areas for development, please be assured that we are committed to building on this success, enhancing our provision further, and addressing ongoing challenges such as funding and SEND, which reflect broader national issues.

## IGS P-16 Taster Day 2025

Following on from our excellent summer results, where IGS was ranked in the top 12% nationally for attainment and top 25% for progress at A level, and our December 2024 Ofsted Outstanding in all areas judgement, where Post 16 was described as a 'Shining light' in our 'amazing' school, we invited in 470 of our applicants for next year's Post 16. This was our biggest taster day event yet and our applications are now surging with over 550 applications for places in September. We offered 130 sessions in one day from our extensive 40 subject curriculum and students really enjoyed the buzz of meeting the other applicants and sampling 5 subjects. Students got the chance to sample our food, explore the post -16 spaces and find out about the choices they need to make for next year. Our applications close on 4th February and we will interview all our applicants between the 12th and 14th February 2025.

### **Charities Week 2024**

During the last week of Term I, students showed great kindness and pride organising events to raise money for charities. Not only did they build essential leadership skills and project management, they also managed to raise an amazing £6742.21. The students voted for the charities they wanted to support, and the money will be split between the RSPCA, Dementia UK and British Heart Foundation.

It was brilliant to see students really push their comfort zones by practising their public speaking skills for a good cause.

We had a range of events such as breakfast clubs, candy cane deliveries, tombolas, and food banks collections. Year 7 were very festively dressed for Christmas Jumper Day.

Students who made the most effort in planning and organising will be **receiving awards this half-term** as thanks for their hard work.

Year 12 were also part of our annual Christmas gift giving with Ilkley Good Neighbours. They raised money at Tesco for the gifts, attended parties in local homes and visited residents to deliver presents. They were highly praised and were a real credit to the school.
