








Transition Roadmap















Transition dates!

Date	Activity	
Friday 14 th March	Acceptance of place at IGS!	
Ongoing through transition period	Contact with primary schools about you!	
1 day in May/June	The IGS Roadshow: this is your chance to find out all you want to know about IGS. You will enjoy a visit at your primary school from some of the year 7 pastoral team to give you a flavour of what life will be like as a pupil at Ilkley Grammar School. You will also have the opportunity to ask any questions ahead of secondary transition in summer 2025.	
1 day in June/July	IGS Discovery Days: This is chance for you to really understand what life at Ilkley Grammar School is all about! You will spend a day on the IGS site enjoying a sample of some curriculum lessons in our specialist classrooms, being taught by our subject experts. You will also get to see the IGS site on an operational school day and enjoy lunch in one of our catering areas.	
Tuesday 1st July 2025	Y6 Transition Day: Your final step on your transition roadmap before you depart your primary schools and join the IGS team! You will attend IGS with the whole new year 7 cohort. It will be fantastic to have you all together in your first assembly and then meet your form tutor and tutees. During the day you will explore the school site once again to aid orientation, engage in some tutor group icebreakers and activities, enjoy lunch at IGS and meet key staff members.

September 9 th , 11 th 12 th (TBC)*	IGS Teambuilding and Sports Days: Enjoy a day of team building and sports activities at Ben Rhydding Sports Club with tutor groups within your band! - At the end of term, we also run Celebration Assemblies for each year group.



What do I do when I need help?

We all have problems from time to time. We know you can only do your best when you feel happy and safe, so please let us know if you are worried about anything at school or at home.

You will get to know your Form Tutors really well, so they will be the best person to speak to. You can also speak to your Head of Year, or any of the team based in your hub on P Floor. They will listen to you and help. It always helps to talk.
